St. Mary's Choir

This has been a year of transition in the choir, as key senior choristers moved on to university, and less experienced singers have taken on increasing responsibility. It is good to report that the number of junior choristers continues to grow, thanks in large measure to the enthusiasm of Valerie Lintott, who not only takes a major part in these singers' vocal and musical training, but also coordinates the Royal School of Church Music award scheme which provides the training with a useful framework. The RSCM awards have proved popular with adult choir members as well as with younger choristers, and it is good to report that as well as the 3 choir members who have achieved awards this year, a further 4 adults and 12 children are currently working towards awards at various levels.

The choir has maintained its usual full programme, adding to its regular commitments with a choral evensong as part of the Horsham Festival, and singing carols in the Carfax, and at the Strawford Day Centre. The joint concert with Slinfold Concert Band was again well received, raising a significant sum for the Thanks a Million appeal, and another event is planned for May 2018. We are also looking forward to our forthcoming visit to Tewkesbury Abbey, where we will be singing all the services from Wednesday 22nd to Sunday 26th August.

Our thanks are due to all who support and encourage the music-making at St Mary's, and who see the choir and organ as an important part of our parish worship. In the words of the choristers' prayer which we say together in the choir vestry after each service, what we sing with our lips may we believe in our hearts, and what we believe in our hearts may we show forth in our lives.

Kairos has evolved and yet it is still an informal and welcoming service for the noisier (possibly the noisiest?) part of the church family! Looking at the numbers of people, including children, attending, the Kairos congregation is about 1/5 of the whole church family (about 200 per month).

The planning team meets 3 times a year to discuss themes, logistics of the service and social events. This year we have looked at the themes of Jesus is a person, a king and a God, the Kingdom of God parables, two prayers of Jesus, Easter & Pentecost, exploring worship, going out & telling others, WWJD on holiday, God's creation & our responsibility, and God's love.

We have established the annual events of the summer Kairos picnic in the vicarage garden and the Advent Christingle service. This year there were some extra special events with a praise party to celebrate the patronal festival/St Mary's birthday party, a visit from OPEN THE BOOK and a praise music workshop using masses of percussion and ribbons.
