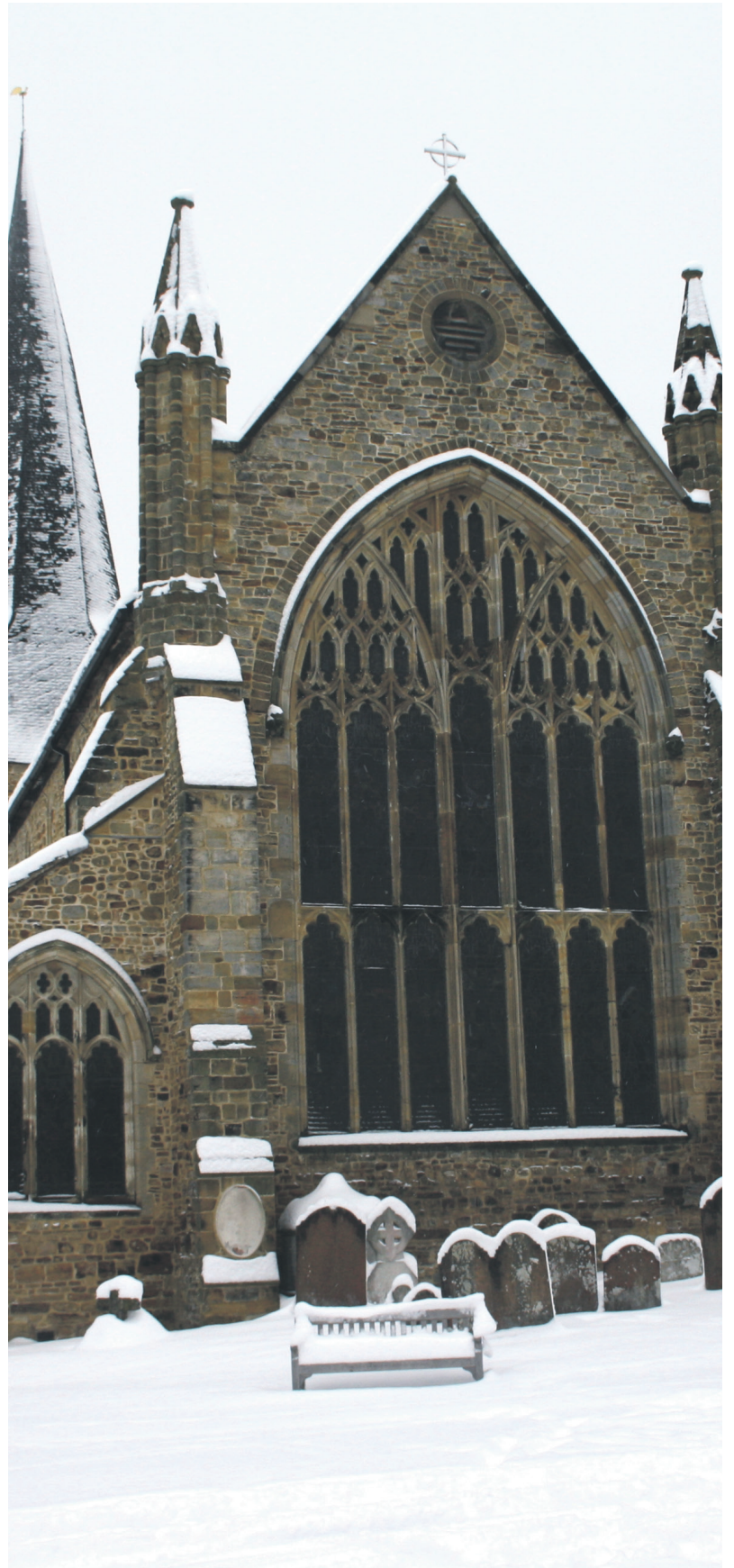
From 4pm the carol service will begin followed by a huge fireworks display from Aurora Fireworks.
