HALL

Heating - Since the installation of the boost button we have had far fewer complaints about hall temperature.

Storage - still proves to be a problem area with chairs and tables still continuing to be stacked in front of the cleaner's shelves. The state of the Cochrane room and the standard of chair stacking on the trolleys has improved but this unfortunately hasn't extended to the table trolley! A general audit of storage still needs to be actioned.

Lights - We haven't been aware of any complaints of lights being left on overnight but since all the light bulbs are gradually being replaced with LEDs this won't be much of an issue anyway.

Future issues - It is noted that the floor in the main hall is deteriorating, including one loose board, and this will need to be addressed fairly soon.
