St Mary's Mission Giving for 2020

Each year St Mary's supports a number of organisations. Support may be financial and / or more practical eg: with Harvest gifts, our time and talents or with our prayers. In 2019 the organisations we support are:

- Horsham Matters Youth Project,
- Family Support Work,
- TeachBeyond.

All will receive £1000 this year as missional giving.

- Turning Tides Horsham project, which was this year's Lent charity and received the proceeds of the Lent Lunches and Lent collection boxes.
- Salvation Army Hope In project, who will again receive out Harvest gifts this autumn
- Christian Aid, who will receive the special Christmas collections via envelopes in the pews at the major service.
- Horsham Matters, with many in the church family supporting the Night Shelter and Foodbank.

Intercessions for these organisations are included in each week's pew sheet and there is more information on the noticeboard at the back of the church.

The choice of supported organisations has historically been based on recommendations made to the DCC by the Serving and Transforming the Community (SATTC) MAP Team. For 2020 we should like to encourage members of the church family to nominate organisations for support.

In the recent past, three organisations have been chosen to receive mission giving, representing between them local, regional and global concerns. We have been keen to support organisations where there is a personal link with St Mary's, as there has been with TeachBeyond, World Vision and Condor Vision Trust in recent years.
