Across the Parish

Save the date! We will be holding a parish lunch, in St Mary's Vicarage Garden, on **Sunday 13th August**. More details to follow, but for now, please keep the date!

The Horsham Artists' Art Trail will once again see artists and makers across the Horsham District open their doors to the public this June. Following the trail will lead you to discover 36 artists and makers in 13 different locations across the Horsham District. These range from artists' homes, studios and retail spaces in central Horsham, to venues further afield, in Mannings Heath and Henfield to the south and Coolham and Storrington to the west. Visitors can expect to find something unique and distinctive in every venue. The range of creativity on show is hugely diverse, from original paintings, prints and textiles, to jewellery, sculpture, upcycled crafts and more. A colourful brochure and map to help visitors plan their visits on the Horsham Artists Art Trail, will be distributed to venues across the district as well as being available on line where you can view and easily download a copy. We have become aware of a significant number of asylum seekers who have recently moved into the local area, and we are working alongside Horsham Refugee Support Group to support them. Our English Classes for Ukrainians have grown smaller over recent months and so our wellestablished Tuesday morning English lessons in the Barn are soon going to be offered to local asylum seekers, while the few remaining Ukrainians enjoy informal English conversation in the Leslie Room. Just as when we began our Ukrainian ministry, we

had very little idea of how it might pan out, now we find ourselves in a similar situation as we begin to support local asylum seekers. We walk forward into this new ministry aware that there is much to learn, but sensing God's call to do what we can to bless these families who are especially vulnerable as they wait for their asylum applications to be processed. We are applying for grant funding towards this new work, but while we wait for this to be received, we are opening up a fund for donations. This money will be used towards transport and refreshments, and other immediate needs that might arise. Please use this link if you are able to make a donation towards this work:
